COMMUNITY ELIGIBILITY PROVISION (CEP) PUBLIC RELEASE SCHOOL YEAR 2022- 2023

The ScholarMade Achievement Place of Arkansas School District is pleased to announce the district's policy for providing meals at NO CHARGE for all students participating in the National School Lunch Program and/or School Breakfast Program, regardless of eligibility category, during the 2022 - 2023 school term unless otherwise notified. This is made possible through the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Special Assistance Certification and Reimbursement CEP Alternative. Federal reimbursement for meals is based on the percentage of Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) recipients, homeless, runaway and migrant students on file for the 2019 – 2020 Base Year for the district. This information is filed and maintained at the school to ensure the strict confidentiality of each document and must remain safely filed for the entirety of the school district's CEP status. The information will be made available only to State and Federal officials for review. All adults, e.g., visitors, teachers, support staff members, and administrators of the district must assume the full cost of the meal which is \$2.50 for Breakfast and \$4.35 for Lunch.

Nondiscrimination Statement: This explains what to do if you believe you have been treated unfairly.
